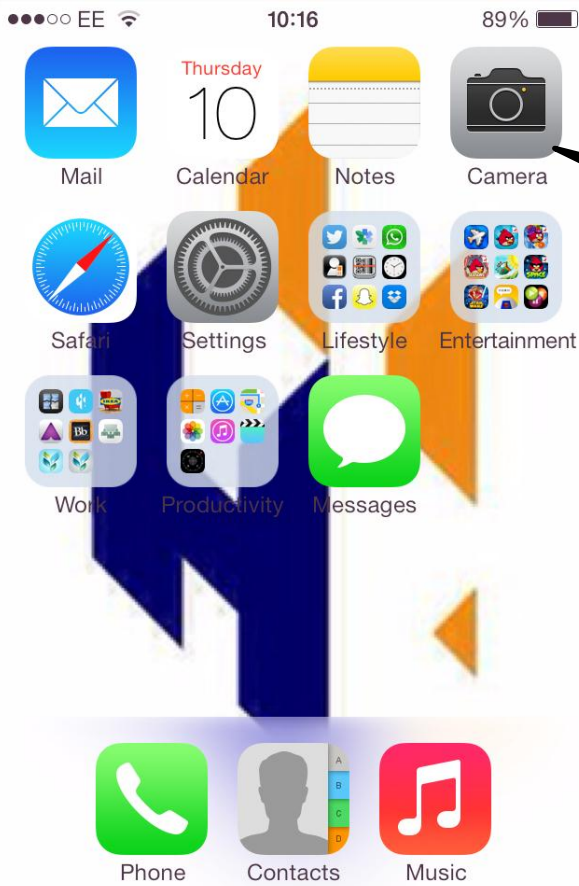
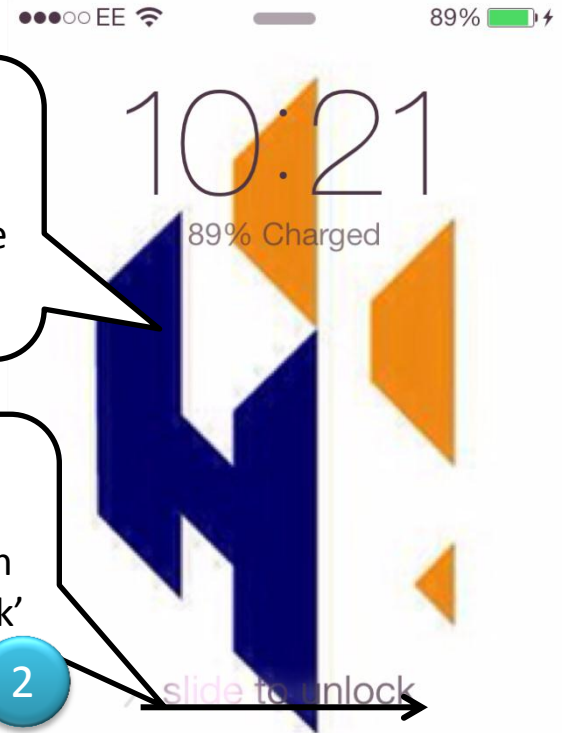


1 This is your lock screen. You will find that your background image will be different. Here you will find Basic information like the time, signal, Wi-Fi connectivity and the battery status (If charging it will state the percentage charged).

To unlock your device; you must first press either the power button or home button on your device. This brings up your home screen as seen to the right, swipe the 'Slide to unlock' section on your screen from left to right.

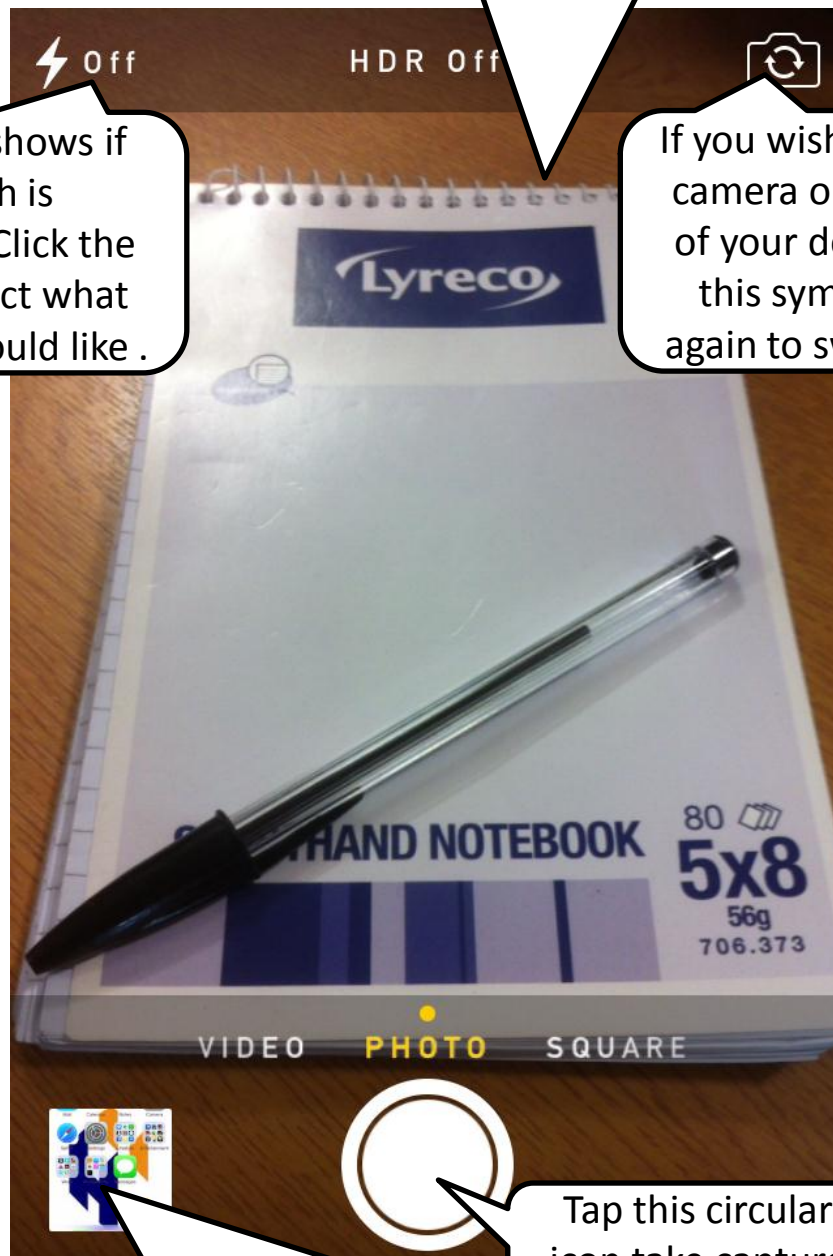


The screen you are brought to lists all of your available apps and resources. You may have created folders to hold a group of apps or you may need to swipe the screen from right to left, which will show you your further pages. In this case, locate your 'Camera' app and tap it once.

The 'Camera' app will then load up showing instantly what your camera is seeing straight away.

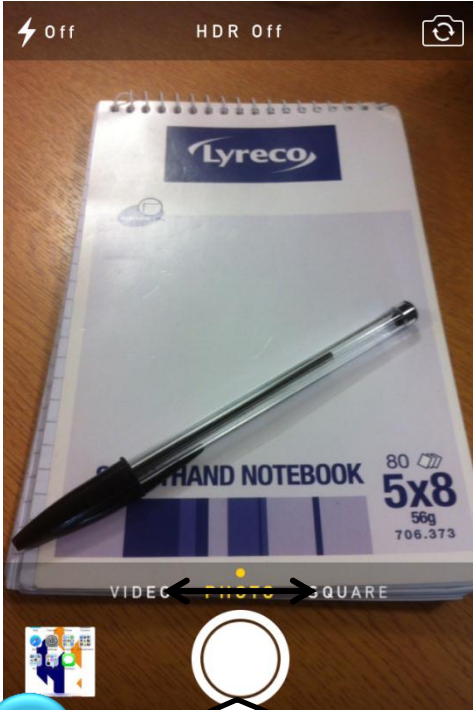
This symbol shows if your flash is on/off/auto. Click the logo and select what setting you would like .

If you wish to use the camera on the front of your device, click this symbol, click again to switch back.

Once an image is taken it will appear here in your 'Camera roll'. It does not directly take you here, as it gives you the flexibility to take more pictures quickly.

Tap this circular icon take capture an image.



7 Swipe the text 'Video/Photo/Square' in order to change your capture type.

This is how the Camera appears in 'Square' mode. As you can see in all 3 different modes the image are zoomed in more than in other modes. Therefore check after switching your modes that you still have everything in the capture space.



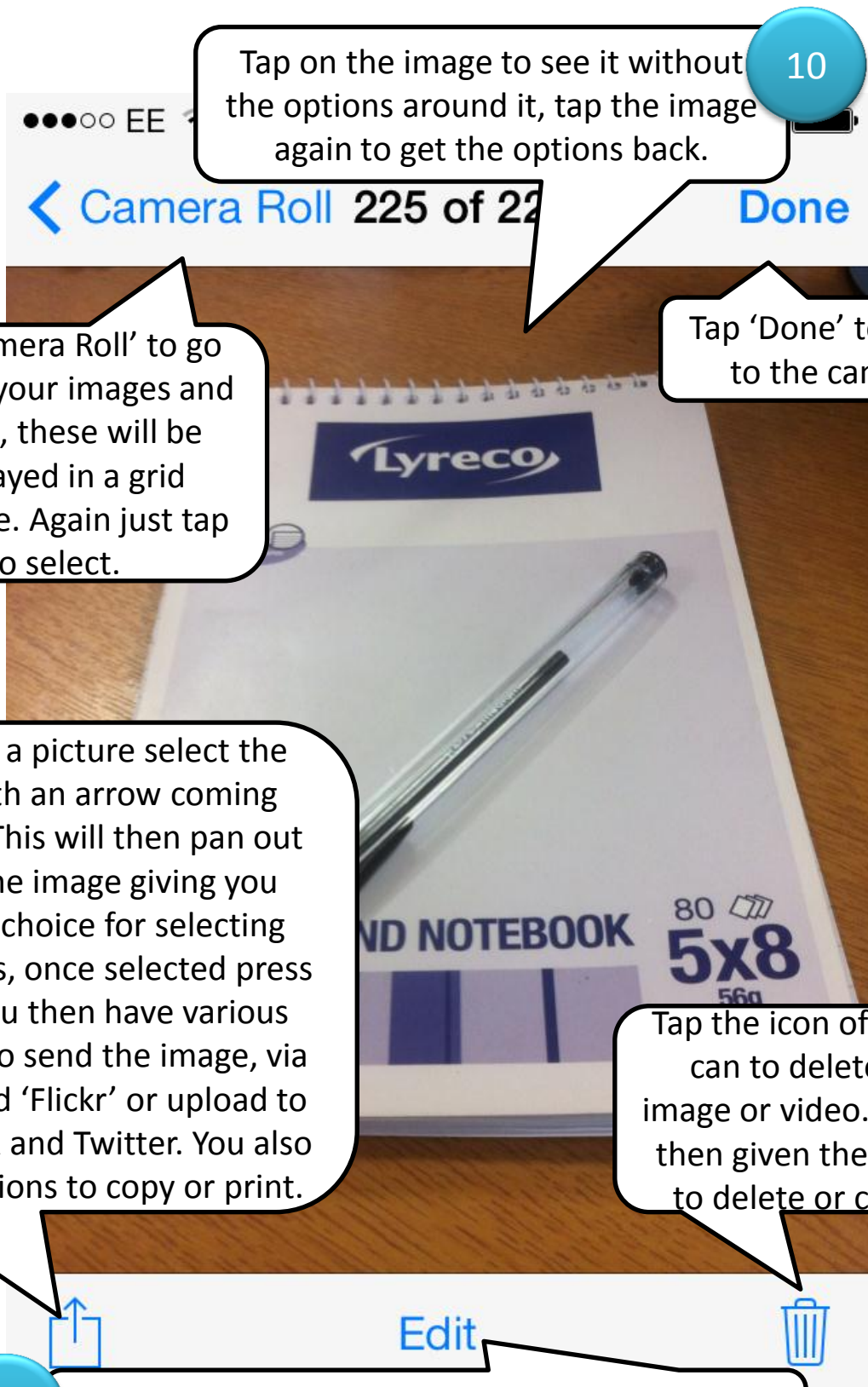
9 Once you have captured or recorded what you want, select the small image in the bottom left corner of your screen, to bring up the image or video.



This bar now shows the length of your video as you are recording.

8 In video mode tap the Red circular logo to begin recording and tap again to stop recording.





10 Tap on the image to see it without the options around it, tap the image again to get the options back.

Tap 'Camera Roll' to go to all of your images and videos, these will be displayed in a grid structure. Again just tap to select.

Tap 'Done' to return to the camera.

To send a picture select the box with an arrow coming from it. This will then pan out from the image giving you further choice for selecting more files, once selected press next. You then have various options to send the image, via 'Mail' and 'Flickr' or upload to Facebook and Twitter. You also have options to copy or print.

Tap the icon of a trash can to delete the image or video. You are then given the option to delete or cancel.

Click edit to apply basic corrections to an image, such as cropping, filters or red eye reduction.

The edit screen then displays the image with all of the basic options.

Once you have done any editing and you are happy with it, remember to tap 'Save'. If you are not happy with the changes tap 'Cancel'.

Tapping this icon will give you various filters to choose from, tap on the filter to preview what it will look like. If you are happy with the filter tap 'Apply' in the top right corner.

This icon, gives you the ability to crop an image. Use the corners to crop manually or use the aspect option to select a predefined size.

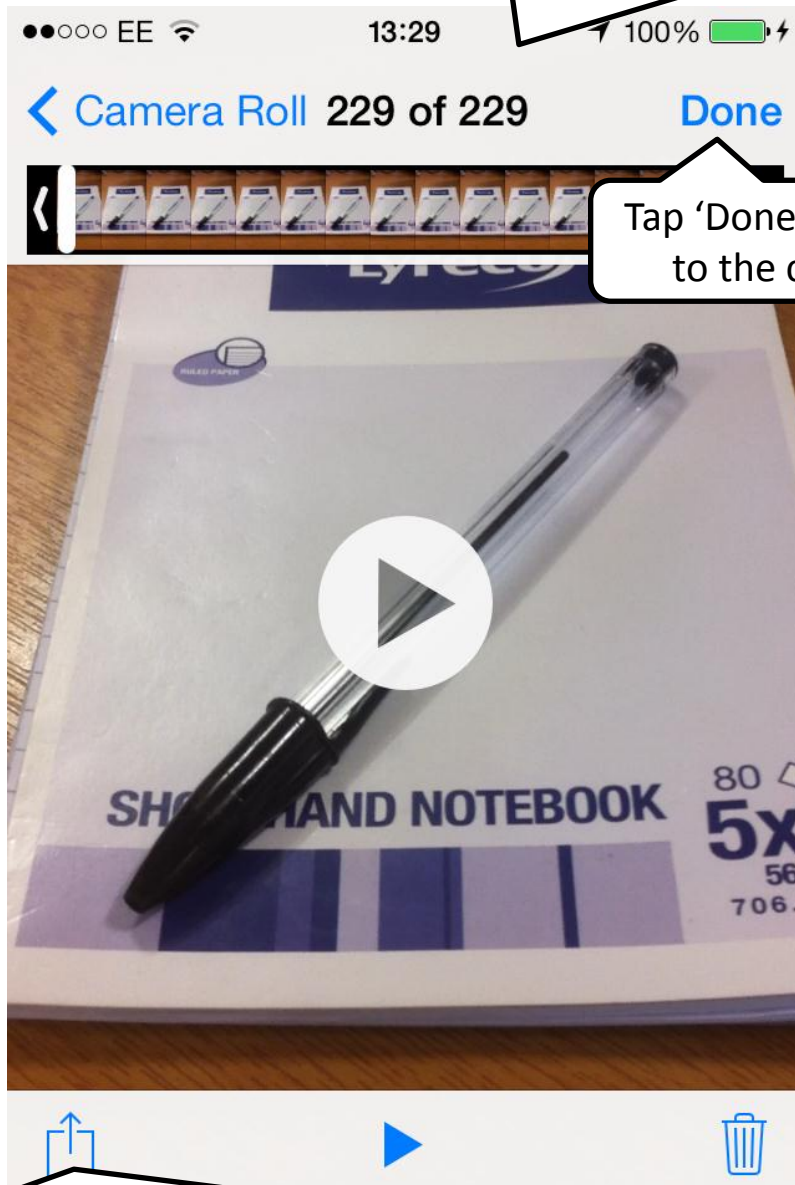
This will rotate the image 90° anti-clockwise.

This icon turns on 'Auto-enhance' this will effect lighting in the image, and make it slightly sharper (every image is different).

If you take an image, which creates red eye, tap this icon and then select the area with red eye'.

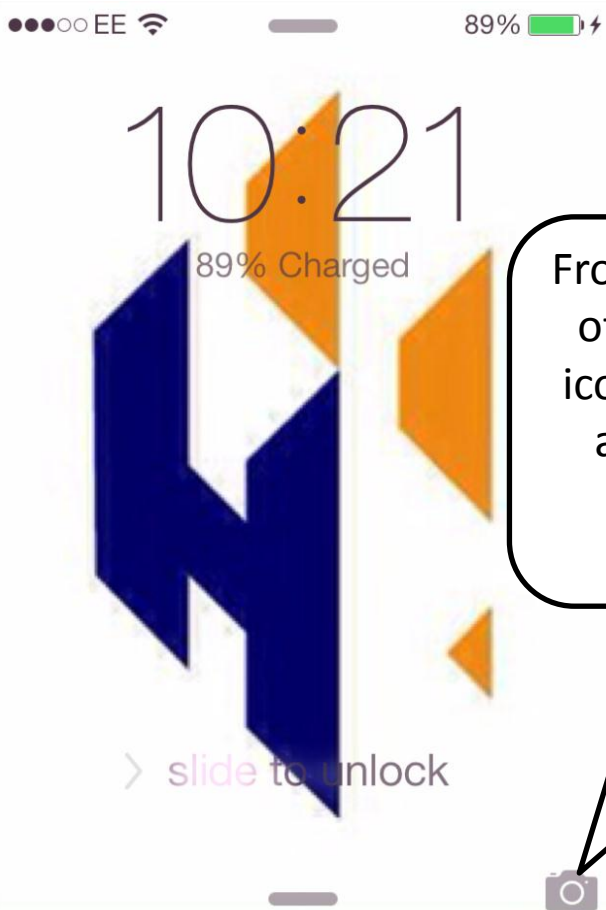

If you select a video in the 'Camera roll' you will be able to watch the video and scroll through, but you will not have any editing abilities.



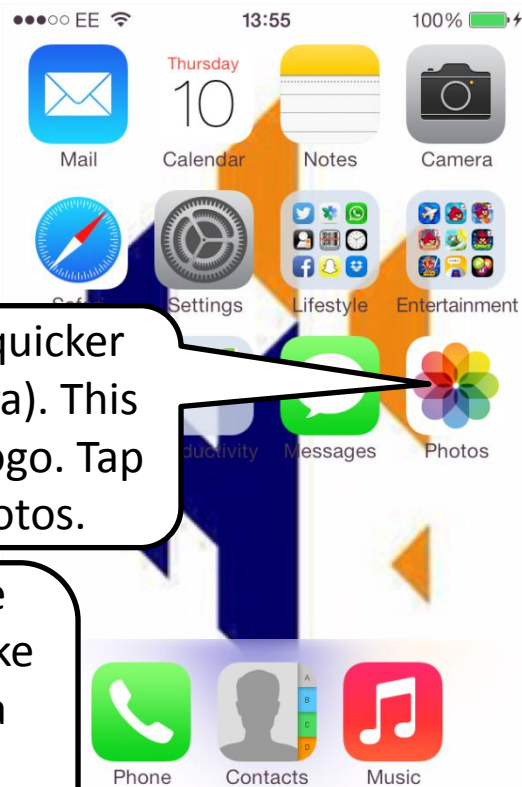
Tap 'Done' to return to the camera.

To send the video select the box with an arrow coming from it. This will then pan out from the video giving you further choice for selecting more files, once selected press next. You then have various options to send the video, via 'Mail', 'YouTube' and 'Vimeo' or upload to Facebook and Twitter. You also have the option to create a slideshow.



As with a lot of features in IOS devices, there are more ways to access certain apps and other areas.

From the lock screen you will find the icon of the Camera. Place your finger on this icon and slide up to the top of the screen and the Camera will open. This is very helpful when you need to capture something quickly.



The Camera Roll can also be found much quicker (instead of having to go through the camera). This can be done by finding your 'Photos' app logo. Tap on this and you will be taken to your photos.

You can then choose whether you would like to view your Camera Roll, videos or 'My Pictures' (synced from your computer).

You will also find that you can switch between your 'albums' and your 'Photos'
