To unlock your device you muse firstly press the power button or the home button and swipe the slide to unlock section at the bottom of the screen.

Locate the settings application and tap it once, your layout may be different to mine.






This is what your settings page looks like. As you can see you have a multitude of pages for you to go through to make your device personal to you.







This is the WI-FI page, although you set up a WI-FI connection in your device set up. When you're out and about you may need to connect to other WI-FI networks.









Using this option you can change the display and brightness settings, just move the slider until you reach a suitable brightness level.

Here you can change the background of your device.





This settings page enables you to change the sound options on your device, you can enable sound using the slider at the top simply drag the curser until you reach an acceptable volume.

You can then change the sounds for certain aspects on your device such as email, reminders and social media notifications.






This is where you can add, edit or create Touch ID using your finger print, although you do this is the initial setup, here you can add more than one finger print.

Again this is only for devices that are iPhone 5s or after, iPad Air 2 or after and iPad mini 3 or after.

You can change the privacy settings of some of your apps and you social networking settings.





You can then set up your iCloud account, you simply tap the first icon and it will bring up a pop up screen where you can enter your details. You will then be able to edit or create your contact information, security and payment options.

You can also choose what is stored on the iCloud buy tapping the slider next to your chosen app. You can also share your location and sign out.





The next section enables you to set up an Apple account, you will need to do this before you start downloading apps.

You then get to go through other settings such as what is shown, what starts to download automatically and whether you want suggested apps displayed.








You will then be able to make changes to the Apple preinstalled apps.
